#### Gin Rummy

Many of us enjoy getting together in the months of Oct, Nov, Jan, Feb, and Mar to play Gin Rummy, which is organized by the Gyrettes. The usual format for Gin Rummy is men against the ladies. I found new rules for Gin Rummy and kind of like them. There is only three.....

1) Ladies must ask their opponent if it is convenient for them to lay down their hands. If their opponent says "no", ladies must wait at least three more rounds before laying down their hands. Gentlemen may lay their hands down at any time.

- 2) If ladies wish to "run" they must run with at least 8 points. If they have less than 8 points they are not allowed to run and must play their hand till the end. Gentlemen may "run" with any number of points to a maximum of 10.
- 3) If the gentlemen win a hand with a total score of more than 50 points, they will be awarded a bonus of 50 points. If this happens on the first or second hand, they will get the 50 bonus points added to all three games. There are no bonus points for the ladies.

Failure by either the ladies or gentlemen to follow these rules will result in severe penalties!

I suspect our Gin Rummy Coordinator will not be instituting these NEW rules!
